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Project outputs:

Online platform for Employability Information & Guidance:

An online IT tool containing open information and training resources to support school and VET learners in the job seeking process.

• Information Point:

To be developed at the San Juan Bautista School, this will provide students with Information and Guidance on Employment and Training resources. Students will be advised on career and employability topics and be encouraged to maintain contact with the school to receive support and assistance in the job seeking process.

• Comprehensive database:

This database will allow teachers to monitor students' career paths.

Link between educational institutions and the business community:

S.T.E.P.S. will establish a network of educational institutions and companies, share experiences and good practice and promote the skills needed in the present and future European labour market.

Such outputs guarantee the sustainability and outreach of S.T.E.P.S. and encourage students to maintain contact with their school as they continue on their career paths.

The project will also create a compilation of good practices in Career and Employment guidance, training material relating to career guidance (FOL) in San Juan Baustista School as well as a competition for students, coordinated by teachers. Students will be invited to submit proposals regarding, "My career pathway: Ideas of a better future for young people in the labour market".

S.T.E.P.S. promotes entrepreneurial culture among students and VET learners, taking into account a European perspective and adaptating to the current labour market situation through:

- Entrepreneurship tools and resources: Developed for students of the schools and VET providers from across each partner's region.
- "The makings for entrepreneurship": A compilation of entrepreneurial skills from schools that shares entrepreneurial ideas with experienced entrepreneurs from other regions.

Complementary activities within the project are:

- Business talks & site visits to companies: Workshops on improving employability for both the employed and self-employed.
- Blogging: To be written in english by students for students, such blogs will focus on "The labour market in the EU". Support is provided by teachers and staff in entrepreneurial and employability guidance issues.
- Mobility of VET Learners
- Employability Guidance Open Day: To be held in Santander, by the end of the project, August 2016.
